Located off of Historical Route 5 and nestled alongside the Chickahominy River this campground offer average to large campsites, wooded lots, two swimming pools, boat ramp and rentals. Over 120 campsites from primitive to full hookup. No cabins and the bathhouses are well maintained but not modern.

Turn off of route 5 into the park and continue past the pool. Follow the road bearing to the right to the park office. It's also a small camp store with friendly staff. The campground does fill up during peak season and weekends so call in advance.

Most sites are wooded but there are some alongside a huge field for a great view that are more open. There are tent and popup sites overlooking the Chickahominy River but no electric and only water bibs (spigot). This park is dog friendly with no weight restrictions. Standard pet policy applies.

Bring your bikes as it is a good place to ride and it is a little bit of a walk to the pool. This pool is open to the public so on weekends and holidays don't expect a leisurely float while reading a book in a float chair.

Size of sites: average to large campsites and all gives you plenty of room to extend your awning. The wooded sites are clear of brush within the site.

Pet Friendly: Park is dog friendly with no weight restrictions. Standard pet policy applies.

Amenities: Boat Access/Launch, Campground, Canoe/Kayak Rental, Fishing, Picnic Areas, Playground, Pool, Restrooms, Store/Concessions, Walking Trails, Wildlife Viewing.

Nearby: This Park is within 20 minutes of Colonial Williamsburg and 25 minutes from Busch Gardens. Its 46 miles and 56 minutes from Virginia Beach. Be prepared for heavy traffic if going through Hampton Roads Bridge Tunnel (HRBT). You are only 10 minutes from Jamestown and a drive north along Route 5 you will find some beautiful plantations of old.

Pros: A beautiful wooded setting with large sites, beautiful scenery, Bike rideable campsite roads, level sites, and walking trails. The large sites give you plenty of room to move around and finding an area to set up a campfire with chairs is no problem. Plenty to do for the whole family and nearby many historical and family fun recreation. Site fees are below average.

Cons: Pool is very nice and well maintained but being open to the public makes it a con for us. Flying insects can be a problem in the warmer weather but you are in the woods.

Site Fee Rating: As of this writing (8-01-2019) the fee range from \$28.00 for basic to \$45.00 for full hook-up. Definitely more towards our price range.
